### Recovery Act – Networking Grant

#### Enabling National Networking of Scientists and Resource Discovery (U24)

The NIH invites applications designed to develop, enhance, or extend infrastructure for connecting people and resources to facilitate national discovery of individuals and of scientific resources by scientists and students to encourage interdisciplinary collaboration and scientific exchange.

Budget requests should be commensurate with project needs for up to a two-year project period. The requested budget may not exceed \$7,500,000 total costs (direct and indirect) per year for a maximum of \$15,000,000 total costs over a two-year project period.

### Grand Opportunities – Due 5/29

#### Research and Research Infrastructure “Grand Opportunities”

Also known as “GO” Grants, the NIH will support projects that address large, specific biomedical and bio-behavioral research endeavors with high short-term impact that will benefit from significant 2-year funds. Budgets must be greater than \$500,000 total costs (direct and indirect) per year for a project period of two years.

#### REMINDER:

*The Grants and Contracts office requires the routing form and all internal documents, along with a draft of the application, seven business days prior to the Sponsor’s deadline.*

*The Grants and Contracts office requires the FINAL application, ready for submission, two business days prior to the Sponsor’s deadline.*

## ARRA Just-In-Time Information

As part of the Recovery Act, the federal government will be reviewing many recently denied Just-In-Time applications. If you see an email with the following phrase, “*This notice is to inform you that your application is being considered for support with funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009...*” prepare yourself to submit a new routing form and financial disclosures in addition to the documents requested by NIH.

Here are some of the JIT documents:

- Revised Abstract and Specific Aims: Must match the two year length of the award
- Application Title and Public Relevance: Should it be necessary, a new application title and public relevance section
- Detailed Budget: Provide a detailed budget for BOTH the 1st year of the grant application and the 2nd year
- Other Support: Up-to-date information on active and pending support for key personnel
- Checklist: A detailed calculation of “Facilities & Administration Costs (F&A)/Indirect Costs”
- Verification of IACUC Approval Letter
- Protection of Human Subjects Assurance Identification and IRB Certification: indicating up-to date IRB approval (310 form)
- Required Education in the Protection of Human Subjects: The NIH requires a letter that includes the names of the key personnel who are responsible for the design and conduct of the study
- Authorizing Signature: A cover letter or email with the above documents, which are prepared by the PI, must be signed by The Authorized Organizational Representative (AOR)
